Vidyasagar, Jamtara



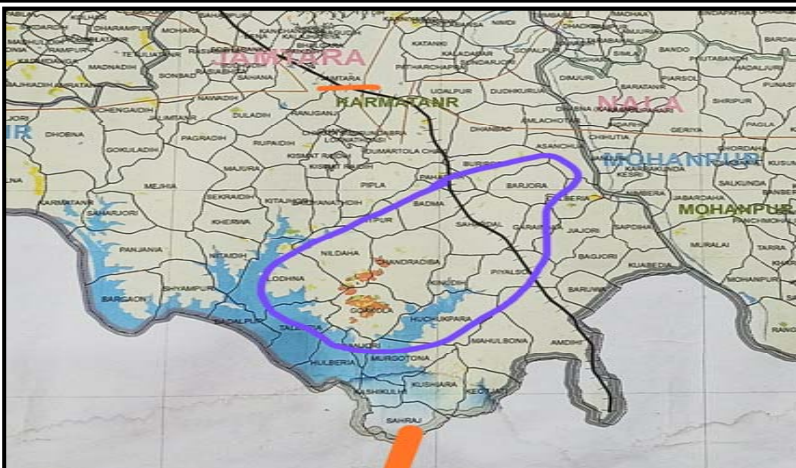

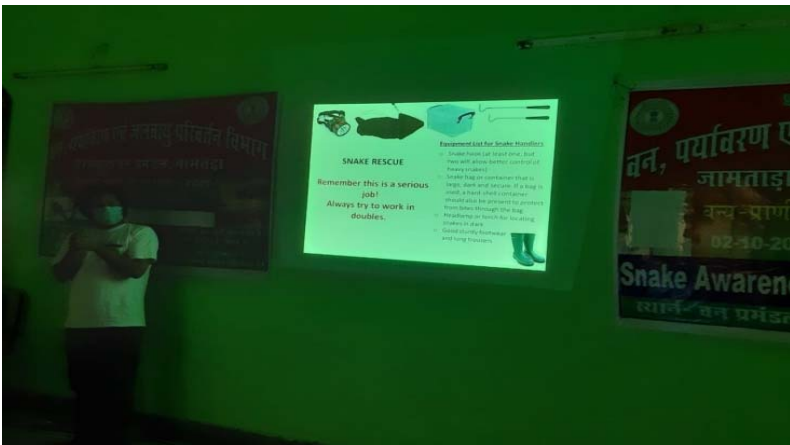
